RESPONSIVE READING

Psalms 118:1, 14, 16, 21–24, 27 (to:), 28; I Chronicles 29:11–13

Ps.118:1 O give thanks unto the Lord; for he is good: because his mercy endureth for ever.

1 | 113:17 (only, to 1st .)

God is good.

2 | 286:17-19

The Scriptures declare all that He made to be good, like Himself, — good in Principle and in idea.

3 | 293:28

Christian Science brings to light Truth and its supremacy, universal harmony, the entireness of God, good, and the nothingness of evil.

4 | 103:15-16

The maximum of good is the infinite God and His idea, the All-in-all.

5 | 2:8-11

God is not moved by the breath of praise to do more than He has already done, nor can the infinite do less than bestow all good, since He is unchanging wisdom and Love.

6 | 3:22

Are we really grateful for the good already received? Then we shall avail ourselves of the blessings we have, and thus be fitted to receive more. Gratitude is much more than a verbal expression of thanks. Action expresses more gratitude than speech.

7 | 4:3-5, 12

What we most need is the prayer of fervent desire for growth in grace, expressed in patience, meekness, love, and good deeds.

The habitual struggle to be always good is unceasing prayer. Its motives are made manifest in the blessings they bring, — blessings which, even if not acknowledged in audible words, attest our worthiness to be partakers of Love.

1 now thus saith the Lord that created thee, O Jacob, and he that formed thee, O Israel, Fear not: for I have redeemed thee, I have called thee by thy name; thou art mine. 2 When thou passest through the waters, I will be with thee; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow thee:

17 And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God and the Father by him.
